

The Background

The Internet, with about 4 billion users worldwide, is the most important infrastructure in the information age. It influences policies, economics and cultures globally and locally. Internet governance issues like management of critical Internet resources (domain names, IP addresses, root servers, protocols), security, stability and resilience of the net, freedom of expression, privacy, intellectual property, eCommerce, new market opportunities, cybercrime, infrastructure development, digital divide, network neutrality, Internet of things etc. make its way into national and international political agendas. For some experts Internet governance will become as important as climate change or energy today. Insofar it is only natural that the way how and by whom the Internet is governed, is a highly controversial issue in the diplomacy of the 21st century.

The Concept

The Summer School offers a unique multidisciplinary high level 40 hours academic programme, both for graduate students and young academics as well as for junior professionals from private sector, government and civil society. The programme is a well balanced mixture of theoretical lectures with world leading academics as well as practical presentations from well known experts working directly in the technical community, the market or in policy. It offers unique opportunities for learning in a multistakeholder environment, which includes also intense and individual interactive communication with faculty members and fellows from all over the world.



The Programme

A one week academic course covers the political, legal, economic, socio-cultural, and technical dimension of Internet governance. The curriculum includes academic lectures, case presentations, and breakout sessions for interactive discussions, as well as a multistakeholder practicum on the following topics:

- History of Internet governance
- Internet governance eco system
- Multistakeholder model - how it works
- Technical regulation and management of the Internet
- Cyber security and human rights
- The business dimension of Internet governance
- Future challenges, perspectives and diplomacy

Moreover a social programme is designed for networking among faculty and fellows.

The Venue

With a history dating back more than a thousand years, Meissen has long been known as the “cradle” of Saxony. That the town is worthy of such a name is clearly seen in its buildings – records of stone which bear witness to the different epochs of not only Saxon history but also the history of the Holy Roman Empire.

Lectures as well as the guest rooms for the faculty and fellows are at St. Afra Monastery, which was founded in 1205 as an “Augustiner Chorherrenstift”. Gotthold Ephraim Lessing, the father of the German enlightenment, went to school here.
